aburrido	to be bored	to be boring
atento	to pay attention	to be attentive
bajo	to be located way down or to be depressed	to be short (in height)
blanco	to be white (after washing)	to be white (naturally)
bueno	to be in good health, to be fine, to taste good	to be good, honest; to be a good person
callado	to be quiet, to not be speaking	to be naturally quiet, to not be a big talker
cansado	to be tired, to feel tired	to be tiring, exhausting, annoying
ciego	to be temporarily blinded by something	to be a blind person
considerado	refers to general opinion about something or someone. to be (well or poorly) regarded.	to be considerate of other people
débil	to be weak	to be a weakling
despierto	to be awake	to be bright, smart
dispuesto	to be prepared or willing	to be active
divertido	to be enjoying oneself, to be amused	to be fun, entertaining, amusing
fresco	to be fresh	to be cheeky, a smart aleck

frío	to be cold in terms of	to be unfeeling, frigid, cold in

gordo	to be getting fat, to look out of shape	to be fat
grave	to be in very poor health	to be serious
interesado	to feel interest or to be interested in something	interested in something solely for financial or material reasons
limpio	to be clean (after washing)	to be clean (naturally)
listo	to be ready	to be smart, clever
loco	to be acting crazy	to be certifiably crazy
malo	to be or feel ill, to taste bad	to be a bad, cruel person or thing
molesto	to be upset or annoyed by something	to be annoying, irritating
muerto	to be dead	to be a bore
negro	to be furious	to be black
nervioso	to feel nervous	to be a naturally nervous, anxious person
nuevo	to be like new	to be brand new
orgulloso	to feel pride, satisfaction for something	to be proud, arrogant
seguro	to be sure, certain	to be safe
verde	to be unripe	to be green
viejo	to be getting old, looking old	to be old
vivo	to be alive	to be extremely clever
